Overall Review of 2022-2023 Year

Program Strengths:

- 1. There were no program findings during the FY23 monitoring process.
- 2. Data collected shows that the program has had a substantive impact on meeting the needs of high-risk adolescents in the Athens-Clarke Community.
- 3. The program uses data to support quality improvements at all sites including professional learning for staff.
- 4. The program met all programmatic deadlines that were assigned.

- 8. Continue offering engaging academic and enrichment activities.
